ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

**Wokingham Borough Council (Park and Ride Parking Places)
(Civil Parking Enforcement) Order 2025**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Wokingham Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") in exercise of its powers in relation to off-street parking places under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 33, 35, 37,38, 39, 46 and 124 and Part III and IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the 1984 Act" as hereinafter defined), The Traffic Management Act 2004 ("TMA 2004" as hereinafter defined") and of all other enabling powers; in accordance with Section 39(3) of the 1984 Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20, Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act has made the above named order which will come into effect on **8th April 2025**.

The effect of the Order will be to designate Thames Valley Park & Ride (Maiden Erleigh and Whitegates), Winnersh Park & Ride (Winnersh) and Coppid Beech Park & Ride (Wescott) as formal Park and Ride parking places within the borough. The order also seeks to incorporate the parking restrictions at the three parking places into one Traffic Regulation Order for ease of enforcement. The use of these parking places for park and ride will help reduce traffic congestion in town center locations, improve journey times and air quality in and around town center locations, thereby supporting the Councils objective of promoting sustainable travel.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the making of the Order, that person may, within 6 weeks of the date of the making of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
